HOW TO FUNDRAISE

The easiest way to fundraise for the Soccer Aid for UNICEF Academy is to set up an online fundraising page.

Here, your supporters can add donations directly, whilst you can also add any donations you collect and shout about how incredible your fundraising effort has been.

- Head over to www.justgiving.com/ campaign/socceraidacademy2025 to set up your online fundraising page.
- When setting up the page, don't forget to include your school's name and the town you're in!
- Share your JustGiving URL with your school community so they can add their donation to the page.
- You can also create a QR code by adding '/qrcode/' at the end of the URL in your address bar - your page's unique QR code will then appear.
- TOP TIP: Print your JustGiving page QR code and place around the school to help boost your fundraising total!





If you cannot set up your own fundraising page, you can still directly donate to the Soccer Aid for UNICEF Academy JustGiving page. Simply scan this QR code, pick the amount you'd like to donate and enter your school's name.

CHALLENGE 1

THE GOAL SCORING & CELEBRATION WORKSHOP

DESCRIPTION

Pupils will aim to score as many points as possible by shooting a ball at different targets in the goal.

Following their goal, each pupil will create their own personal goal celebration, inspired by iconic goal celebrations such as Usain Bolt's lightning bolt, Ronaldo's Siuu and Ella Toone's heart gesture.

Be creative, dramatic, silly, get the teachers to be in goal - whatever it is, get practising and flaunt your moves in this Soccer Aid Academy showdown!

SKILLS DEVELOPED

Through this challenge, pupils will get active and build their sporting stamina and skill. They will also be able to express creative thinking as they celebrate their goal. Don't forget to score pupils on their celebration too!

SET-UP

The challenge should be adapted to the needs and abilities of the pupils. You might want to think about equity between different abilities within the group here to ensure that everyone is included.

Ball(s)

Goal

Scoring targets – use any available equipment such as hoops or cones

Paper and pen for scoring

HOW TO PLAY

- Watch Goal scoring & Celebration challenge video with Diamond
- 2 Set up your goal and add some targets
- Warm-up, and practice shots and celebration moves in small groups
- 4 Pupils take turns to kick the ball into the goal, their score is recorded for each play. We suggest each child has 3-4 kicks, but teachers can adapt based on time
- 5 Pupils score and celebrate their goal
- 6 Scores tallied, and the winner congratulated



HINTS AND TIPS FOR GOAL CELEBRATIONS

 A move that represents how you feel when you score a goal or succeed at something

This could represent how the right of freedom of expression (Article 13) or good health (Article 24) makes you feel

- It can incorporate body movement, dance, words or song
- Your celebration should be unique and inclusive, showing the joy and happiness of success

OPTIONAL EXTRA ROLES

- Referee/manager (telling pupils when to shoot)
- Score counter
- Winners' trophy design and build
- Goal set up and reset







CHALLENGE 2

THE RELAY RACE

DESCRIPTION

A team challenge to get a football through an obstacle course, racing against classmates to reach the end of the course and score a goal in the fastest time.

Don't forget to include practice rounds!



SKILLS DEVELOPED

Soccer Aid for UNICEF is all about teamwork and this challenge will bring pupils together to develop their communication and listening skills, enabling them to build friendships and work as a team to complete their relay race. Pupils will have the chance to get creative, play and race in a bid to become the winning team.

Remember, it's not all about winning and just by taking part, each pupil is helping to protect play for every child, as every child has the right to play (Article 31).

SET-UP

You know your pupils' interests and needs best: please adapt the challenge to suit your group. It could be a simple set of cones to dribble around OR the children can be engaged in designing their own obstacle courses. If you have time, you can do multiple relays using different pupil's obstacle course designs.

Ball(s)

Goal

Scoring targets – use any available equipment such as hoops or cones

Paper and pen for scoring

HOW TO PLAY

- Watch the Relay Race challenge video with Diamond
- 2 Design obstacle course (optional)
- 3 Set up obstacle course(s)
- 4 Pupils put into teams (of equal size)
- 5 Each team to complete the obstacle course in relay
- 6 Times recorded, and the winner/ winning team congratulated

THE BIG SOCCER AID FOR UNICEF ACADEMY QUIZ

SOCCER AID FOR UNICEF ACADEMY

DESCRIPTION

The Big Soccer Aid for UNICEF Academy Quiz is designed as a fun and interactive way for pupils to learn about how their fundraising and involvement is making a difference for children around the world. Using age-appropriate questions, pupils will build their understanding on a range of topics including sport, geography, the work of UNICEF and children's rights, such as the right to an education (Article 28).

Children can take part in teams or individually. There are three versions of the quiz that vary in difficulty, you can pick which you feel best suits your class.

SKILLS DEVELOPED

Having taken part in two challenges and two Soccer Aid for UNICEF Academy lessons, pupils might now be wondering what they've been doing it for? This is their chance to find out!

The session will end with a short video from Tom Grennan which highlights how your school are making a difference for children in countries such as Cambodia, giving you the opportunity to discuss the video and the importance of play for children around the world.

Please note, the content of the film shows the harsh realities of some of the children UNICEF works with in Cambodia and some viewers may find it upsetting. Please view the video before showing it your class to ensure it is suitable for your learners.

SET-UP

- Academy Quiz
- Primary school quiz
- Secondary school quiz
- Template for quiz answers (keep hidden!)
- Paper and pens for all pupils/teams
- Space such as a classroom to do quiz
- Designate a quiz master to read out questions - e.g. teacher or selected student



HOW TO PLAY

- Children to split into teams (if desired), and each have pen and paper for answers
- Watch The Big Soccer Aid for UNICEF Academy Quiz challenge video with Diamond
- Jesignated quiz host to read out each question, and participants to write down answers
- 4 Answers are shared with pupils, and participants self-score

- Scores are handed in to the quiz master, who can then announce the top three in reverse order
- 6 Winner/winning team congratulated
- Watch Soccer Aid impact film where Tom Grennan meets Theara in Cambodia
- Teacher facilitated discussion about the video and the importance for all children to have opportunities to play and how UNICEF is helping to protect play for all children around the world.

TEACHER HINTS AND TIPS

This is a great opportunity to update parents and caregivers about what pupils have been up to and to send a reminder for any final donations.

TOM GRENNAN'S VISIT TO CAMBODIA

Earlier this year, Tom travelled to Cambodia to see first-hand how UNICEF are supporting children in Phnom Penh. Tom met 14-year-old Theara, who lives with his family in an area that poses many dangers to children — none more so than the live railway line that runs through the middle of the community.

Tom visited UNICEF-funded safe spaces that help children like Theara to access education and simply to play, out of harm's way.

Soccer Aid has always been close to my heart, but being asked to see where the money that is raised goes has completely shifted my whole view on what Soccer Aid is about. UNICEF have helped to create this community centre and this safe place for children to learn and play, to just be kids. I'm proud to be a part of it. Tom Grennan Tom visited a UNICEF-supported centre in Phnom Penh, which provides children like 14-year-old Theara with a safe space to play
